

SPOTLIGHT ON A MEMBER: *Tess Laoruangroch*

Tess Laoruangroch received the Ginintuang Ani Award (Golden Harvest Award) in nursing from her alma mater in the Philippines - Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Maynila.

The award is to acknowledge and honor PLM graduates who have excelled in their fields, and inspire all. The trophy is a three-sided pyramid representing karunungan (intelligence), kaunlaran (progress), and kadakilaan (humanitarian, honor). Encased in the middle of the trophy is a rice stalk, signifying growth and fertility.

She was nominated by her classmates and the award ceremony was held during the university's 50th year gala night celebration. Her family was able to attend the award ceremony which made the evening even more special.

Pamantasan is a university funded and supported by the city of Manila for the poor, deserving students. Entrance exams were taken and students were required to keep a particular grade average. Admittance to the nursing program required an entrance exam and only 50 students were accepted per batch. Tess graduated

as the valedictorian and was the first from the college to receive the university's cum laude award. She took the Philippine nursing board exam and out of almost the 2000 examinees, she received the highest score. These accomplishments and later achievements post graduate qualified her to receive the award. ■



SPOTLIGHT ON A MEMBER: *Phoebe Williams*



University of Kansas School of Nursing Professor Phoebe Williams, PhD., RN, was named the 2014 Kansas Nurse of the year in Research by the state chapter of the American Nurses Association.

Williams' current research has focused on outcomes research in oncology care for adults and children, mixed methods research, instrument development and international and diverse and diverse groups' research.

"This award recognizes Dr. Williams for her research to help children with cancer and their families" says Marge Bott, associate dean of research at Kansas School of Nursing.

Williams, who joined the School of Nursing faculty in 1992, received the award from the Kansas State Nurses Association (KSNA) during its annual membership assembly business meeting October 20 in Overland Park.

The award recognizes Williams for excellent research capabilities, the impact of her research and the relevance of her research to the nursing profession, as well as her contributions as a role model. Williams' earlier research had focused on the care of families and children with chronic illness and growth and development.

Williams teaches graduate and undergraduate honors research, and dissertation and Capstone advising. She has published books, book chapters, numerous peer-reviewed data based articles, and educational materials dealing with her areas of practice. ■

PNAGKC members have been hard at work volunteering their time and talent to various events and organizations through out the Kansas City area. Over 200+ hours of volunteer time has been provided by our members. Volunteer activities include:

- Staffing the Homeless Clinic on Saturday mornings
- Delivering meals to the home bound
- Helping sort medical supplies and equipment at the Sisters of St. Frances
- Collecting medical supplies for our collaborative medical missions
- Heart to Heart Educational Sessions
- Donating clothing, toys, and needed supplies in addition to providing dinner to the Battered Women and Children Shelter
- Health Fairs and First Aid Station Attendees

The recent medical mission overseas was held in Ormoc City, in the island of Leyte, Philippines from February 5 - 15 2015. It was sponsored by the World Outreach Foundation and the Medical Missions Foundation. PNAGKC was instrumental in the recruitment of volunteers especially doctors and nurses .

Ormoc City is a port city and it is a commercial, cultural hub off northwestern part of Leyte island. The city was also among the hardest hit by the typhoon Haiyan the other year. Our venue was Ormoc District Hospital, a government hospital serving the indigent population. It is a 100 bed hospital but the daily census is over 100 patients. The hospital was severely damaged by the typhoon Hyan but now is partially rehabilitated. Our medical clinic, dental clinic , eye surgeries, minor surgeries, health and diabetic screening were done in the newly unfurnished outpatient building of the hospital. Our major surgeries were done in the hospital two OR rooms. With the resourcefulness of our OR team they were able to make three OR tables in one room for two EENT cases, and one Gyne case done simultaneously, and two OR tables in the other room for our general surgery and their emergency cases done simultaneously.

We were able to accomplish 56 major surgeries (EENT, Gyne, General surgeries) 72 minor surgeries mainly excision of masses and or tumors, 12 adult and one pediatric ophthalmology surgeries mainly pterygium.

For medical clinic, we were able to serve 1,199 patients with hypertension, respiratory, gastro-intestinal, diabetes, back and joint pains. 348 of those were children, with colds and fever, skin infections, gastrointestinal and needed multi-vitamins. For dental clinic, 505 patients were served, mainly tooth extractions, and 49 of those patients were tooth fillings. We also gave 205 reading glasses and did over 100 diabetic screenings. In addition to delivering needed health services, the large part of the World Outreach Foundation's work before the mission was participating in the rehabilitation of the hospital. Our medical mission team was composed of local doctors, nurses and lay personnel from Ormoc, Bohol and Manila, dentists from Bohol and the Army and, 20 doctors, nurses, CRNA, and lay personnel from the USA.

The mission would not be possible without the teamwork and the passion of the volunteers to help the people of Leyte. Among them were the local doctors and nurses , lay personnel from Ormoc, Bohol and Manila, Dentists from Bohol and the Army and the 20 doctors, nurses, CRNAs, lay personnel from the USA composed our medical mission team. The PNAGKC volunteers were Leila Busch, Marilyn Dizon, Arvin Figueroa, Amor Valera and myself.

There are still work to be done. It is disheartening to see the the patients begging to have their surgeries but were not done due to time constraints. ■

SAFE HAVEN: *A Place To Heal*

Domestic violence is a grave crime against human dignity and can take a number of different forms; emotional, mental, physical, verbal, economic or social. It can be subtle or coercive and physically violent that may lead to disfigurement or even death.

Sadly, this basic human right which is not measured by any human quality, legal mandate, wealth, individual merit or accomplishment is widely abused. Leaving victims shattered, and confused. For many years, victims have endured living in fear, pain, shame and isolation. Those who flee their abuser, find refuge in safe shelter homes like Safehaven, hoping to heal, rebuild and move forward.

Since 2010, the Philippine Nurses Association of Greater

Kansas City continues to reach out and support the victims of domestic violence. Annually, our volunteers distribute clothing, toiletries, books, toys and serve a full dinner course to the residents of Safehaven. Free haircuts and styling are also offered by our volunteer hairstylist.

It is not easy to cut the cycle of domestic violence but we can try. Educating children at an early age to value their self-worth and of others is a great beginning. Perpetrators need to be brought to justice and for justice to be served accordingly. It is also crucial for victims of domestic violence to avail of adequate resources in order to help them secure jobs and find a permanent place to call their home.

Meantime, victims find refuge at Safehaven where they feel safe to rebuild, heal and learn the skills that will support their freedom. And at this place, PNAGKC continues to help mend their broken hearts and lift their shattered spirits. As nurses, we truly make a difference and the legacy we endorse is priceless. ■

SCHOLARSHIP: *PNAGKC Nursing Scholarship Program*

MISSION

The purpose of the PNAGKC Scholarship Program for the Kansas City Region is to:

- Promote nursing education and raise the visibility of the PNAGKC within the local community.
- Provide new educational opportunities for particularly qualified and deserving Filipino American students.
- Promote new membership growth for the PNAGKC.

ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for a PNAGKC nursing education scholarship, students must be:

- Enrolled in an accredited BSN program as a third year student.
- Enrolled as a full time student.
- A Filipino-American resident of Greater Kansas City.

APPLICATION PROCESS

To apply for a scholarship, students must:

- Complete a PNAGKC Scholarship Application.
- Submit 2 written recommendations from college-level professors.
- Submit an essay of 500 words describing their reasons for choosing the nursing profession and pursuing a PNAGKC scholarship.
- Submit all application materials no later than June 15TH.

TO REMAIN ELIGIBLE

To remain eligible for the scholarship, students must:

- Maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA and no failing grades, as confirmed by written transcripts from the school.
- Complete a minimum of 50 hours of community service per school year, and confirm the service hours in writing from the organization(s) served.
- Maintain good moral standing and behavior within the university and community at large.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Scholarships are renewable yearly pending compliance with the above criteria.
- The maximum award is \$250/semester, and \$500/year.
- Scholarships may be used for tuition, books, or required fees.

SELECTION PROCESS

- The PNAGKC Scholarship Committee will meet no later than July 15 to review scholarship applications and select the scholarship award winner.
- Award notifications will be mailed to the scholarship recipient and university administration officials no later than July 30.
- University officials must confirm student enrollment and status no later than August 15.
- Upon receipt of confirmation from university officials, the PNAGKC will remit a check to the scholarship.


