# The 15<sup>th</sup> Annual North Central Regional Convention

The North Central Regional Convention (NCR) was held in the Embassy Suites in Rosemont, Illinois on April 23-26 2015. This a time of year to meet with other chapter presidents from different states, and recognize leaders

from the national level.

The conventions began with a face to face with the delegates from each chapter at 6pm on April 23. Each chapter president or representative stated three major accomplishments from their chapter. Then followed by words of encouragement from President of PNAA Leticia Hermosa and past president Vicky Navarro. Many questions, answers and ideas were discussed. After the discussion, the night was adjourned with dinner provided by the host chapter.

Leadership Institute conference was designed to inspire and provide tools for chapter and regional leaders to successfully lead their chapter/regions and advance in it's mission. Leadership institute began at 8am on April 24. The PNAGKC representatives that attended were Jessamine Endaya, Anna Liza Dewhurst, Leila Busch, Luz Conde, Beth and Ernie Rosas. The program was not your typical lecture class with power

point. It began as an interview of Dr. Reynaldo Rivera, PNAA Education Chair interviewing Leticia Hermosa, President of PNAA. She spoke of her accomplishments and the hardships she had gone throughout her life. Her trials and tribulations have inspired and transformed her to become the nurse, lawyer and leader that she is today. She also spoke about the RN4cast. The RN4cast is a research study tool used to generate information on how nurses affect patient outcomes. A study that was published in 2006-2007 showed that the non-US educated RN had negative impact on mortality and failure to rescue and employment of non-US educated nurses is associated with higher mortality. On the survey itself, the survey had singled out Filipino as individual ethnicity and did not categorize any other Asian ethnicity. In addition, the surveyor of RN4Cast failed to mention to the surveyed how the data would be used and analyzed. It was also discovered that the research was faulty because the data does equate to casualty but a cause and effect relationship. She spoke about how we needed to protect the integrity of the Filipino nurse and will work together with the researchers to change the way research is conducted. Dr. Rivera also spoke about the best practice for implementing the recommendations of the Institute of Medicine (IOM) and transformational leadership, empowering yourself and empowering others. This was an interactive group activity. Each chapter was



able to share and bounce ideas with other chapters. At the end of the leadership education day, the President of the PNAA Foundation, Ernie Rosas presented an award to PNAGKC for their contribution to the PNAA building. Plaque was received by President Jessamine Endaya and President Elect Anna Liza Dewhurst.

Networking night country western began at 600pm in the conference room. The PNAGKC representatives were Jessamine Endaya, Anna Liza Dewhurst, Leila Busch, Luz Conde, Beth and Ernie Rosas. Networking night began with a chapter banner parade assembly. Shine PNAA Shine was sung. Awards were presented to past PNAA presidents and chapter leadership awards presented. Our very own Luz Conde was our Chapter Leadership Awardee. There was also Chapter group chapter presentations who presented country western dances. However, PNAGKC decided surprise everyone by performing a Hula, a prelude to the National Convention in Hawaii. The night was long and everyone had a good time.

The first 3K Run started early in morning on April 25. The purpose of this run was to help raise funds to minimize the amount of monies needed from each chapter in NCR for the 5k run for the National convention. The event was organized by very own Leila Busch and Chapter Presidents of NCR and Regional Vice President Bessie Schiroky. The PNAGKC representatives were Archie Endaya, Luz Conde, Jessamine Endaya, Leila Busch, Anna Liza Dewhurst, Beth and Ernie Rosas. Everyone was awake at 5am. There was a Zumba warm up in the convention room. Music was playing to get everyone pumped for the run. The 3k run took place at the skybridge that linked the Hilton hotel to the shared parking garage at the Embassy Suites. Leila Busch escorted all runner/walkers to the start point. Everyone walked/ran to the finish line. There was one runner who did have a hypoglycemic event during the event but was found to be ok. Winners were announced in the convention room where the 1st and 2nd place winners for the males and females from the 30's and younger division announced, the 1st and 2nd place for the females 30-40 announced, and 1st and 2nd place winners for the males and females from the 50's and above announced. Our very own Archie Endaya placed 1st place in the males 50 and older division and Luz Conde placed 1st place in the female 50 and older division. Everyone was given a commemorative medal for their participation and a group picture was taken to commemorate the event.

Education Day was to provide knowledge and deeper understanding of the growing complexity of healthcare delivery system affecting all disciplines

in health care. Education started around 830 am. The PNAGKC representatives here were Jessamine Endaya, Anna Liza Dewhurst, Leila Busch, Luz Conde, Yollie Endaya, Irma Labre-Wright, Sonia Tumanut, Beth and Ernie Rosas. Topics discussed were Ebola, Recommendations of IOM and Actions Coalition Model and its roles and expectations, Conflict Management, Leadership and Team Building, Future of nursing in a complex healthcare delivery system, mental health illness and common neurologic disorders, mental health issues, stigma, clinical overview and nursing care. It was a long day for everyone but we took it in stride.

Gala Homecoming night began around 8pm. The PNAGKC representatives were Jessamine Endaya, Anna Liza Dewhurst, Leila Busch, Luz Conde, Archie Endaya, Yollie Endaya, Irma Labre-Wright, Sonia Tumanut, Beth and Ernie Rosas. President of PNAA had an inspirational speech about her life experiences the Gala. Speeches by Regional Vice President were lengthy. The past presidents of PNAA were recognized again for their contributions to PNAA and awarded with plaques. All chapter presidents and representatives were asked to sing a song to the past PNAA presidents. More recognition awards were given to many nurses who were instrumental in the production the NCR Convention. Our very own President Jessamine Endaya was given an award for being instrumental in the 3k run. The winner of the Homecoming King and Queen were determined by the most amount of money raised by each candidate. Our very own Ernie Rosas was our chapter representative for homecoming king. The homecoming candidates were escorted and assembled with their chapter presidents. Our homecoming king did not win but we knew he was always a winner in our hearts. The night ended with lots of dancing.

The convention ended with a catholic mass at April 26 at 9am. Then followed by lunch provided by the host chapter. Everyone shared their farewells, passed business cards, and convinced each other to go to the National Convention in Hawaii.

Overall, it was a great experience. It was nice to meet and network with different chapter presidents and the leaders of PNAA. It was a great way to get to know members of your own association as well network with members from different associations. I would recommend members to go a regional convention. ■






# Thank you PNAGKC Emerald Donor



# The 36<sup>th</sup> Annual Philippine Nurses Association of America Convention Hosted by Philippine Nurses Association of Hawaii

The Philippine Nurses Association of America (PNAA) Convention was held at the Hilton Hawaiian Village in Honolulu, Hawaii from July 22- 26, 2015. This was the time of year when all the Philippine Nurses Association from all over America come to meet, learn and network.

The convention began with circle of president's meeting at 3:15pm. The PNAGKC representatives for this convention were Jessamine Endaya, Leila Busch and Anna Liza Dewhurst. Each president introduced themselves and gave their life motto. Followed was a lengthy discussion of changes to the mission and bylaws for PNAA. President Leticia Hermosa was asking for any comments or suggestions about the changes. Many suggestions, comments and concerns were brought to light by different chapter presidents.
